COMING HOME

The beauty and convenience of the Cheshire countryside is at its peak here at Cranberry Gardens in Congleton, where the buzz of modern life can blend seamlessly with the tranquil environment surrounding it. With the least effort you can be in the stunning Peak District, the vibrant city of Manchester or the quaint, historic town centre of Congleton that offers everything you need.

TRANSPORT

With the M6 junction 17 just 6 miles away and on the A34 trunk road, Congleton is ideally situated to reach Manchester 26.4 miles away, or Stoke-on-Trent 13.8 miles away, making the historic town perfect for commuters. The A534 heading west, the A54 leading to the north-west and the A536 heading north east also lead out of Congleton.

Congleton Railway Station is 1.6 miles away and sits on the Cross Country and Northern train lines. The lines take travellers to Stoke on Trent and beyond to the south and Manchester to the north, which has further links to Liverpool, Yorkshire and direct connections to Birmingham. Manchester Piccadilly is 41 mins by train while Stoke on Trent can be reached in just 16 mins.

SHOPPING

Congleton is well served with shops to cater for every day essentials to gifts, homewares, DIY and supermarkets a short drive away. Congleton Retail Park with a Tesco, Laura Ashley, M&S Simply Food, fashion and homewares is 1.3 miles away while the West Heath Shopping Centre, featuring an Aldi, homewares, restaurants and a pharmacy is 2 miles drive.

Congleton High Street, which is served by paid for parking close by and free parking on the edge of town, is a hub for pubs, bars, restaurants and streets filled with a good mix of independent retailers offering deli and café services, music, fashion and chain stores including Argos and Morrisons.

SPORT & LEISURE

Whether you enjoy getting active at the gym, going for walks and playing golf or appreciating fine art and theatre, Congleton enjoys an enviable mix of pastimes to suit most tastes. Astbury Golf Club 3.7 miles away where you can revel in the challenging course and afterwards rest in the clubhouse. Congleton Leisure Centre in the centre of town ups the ante on activity with a good range of gym facilities, exercise classes, a pool, team sport and sauna.

The Attitude Gallery is a great place to view artwork from across the country and invest in a piece or two, while the 300 seat independent Daneside Theatre is home to regular amateur theatre productions. Congleton Park is a picturesque place to enjoy the fresh air with a children's play area, bowls green, woodland and regular organized events including family fun days, races, shows and music festivals. Round off a day out with a delicious meal in one of the many restaurants and pubs in town, or a drink in a classy bar.

DINING


There is a mouthwatering array of world cuisine on offer at restaurants in Congleton town centre. From the stylish Reubens, 26 Bar & DV8 and Grill to a choice of Indian, Italian, Chinese and traditional British, there are plenty of options for a night out socialising and relaxing with friends and family.

Drink in the stunning Cheshire scenery while tucking into a hearty meal one of many country pubs in the area, including The Church House Inn across the River Dane, or The Plough Inn a short drive along the A536. There is also a good selection of fine dining restaurants nearby, with Pecks Restaurant, offering high end modern British cuisine, just 3.3 miles away.

EDUCATION

High Hopes Nursery is a short drive away, with the small, rural Marton and District C of E Primary School and Eaton Bank Academy providing education to the age of 18. For independent education, Terra Nova School in nearby Holmes Chapel takes pupils from three to 13, while The King's School in Macclesfield welcomes three to 18 year olds.

There is a good selection of GPs surgeries in town, with Meadowside Medical Centre nearby (01260 272331 Sat Nav CW12 1DY) with NHS dental practice, Congleton Dental Centre (01260 291059 Sat Nav CW12 1JN), also in town.

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
Directions

From M6 Junction 18 (north and southbound)
From the M6 southbound Junction 18 take the first exit, A54 Middlewich Road, towards Holmes Chapel.
From Junction 18 of the M6 northbound take the third exit at the roundabout. Turn right onto Chester Road/A54 and continue until the roundabout and take the first exit onto the A34. At the next roundabout take the second exit onto the Clayton Bypass/A34. At the roundabout, take the second exit and stay on the A34. On Manchester Road take a slight right and take the Macclesfield Road/ A536. Turn right onto Macclesfield Road/ A536. Cranberry Gardens is on the left.

From the A523/A54

From the A523 southbound, turn right at the crossroad onto the A54. From the A523 northbound turn left at the crossroad onto the A54. Follow the A54 and turn right into Church Lane. Church Lane becomes Bank Lane. Continue on Bank Lane, then turn left onto Macclesfield Road. Cranberry Gardens will be on the left.
